Robert Wentworth Little Memorial Dedication



Robert Wentworth Little 1838 - 1878

Wednesday, 22 October 2014 saw the dedication of the restored memorial to Robert Wentworth Little in Camberwell Old Cemetery.

Born in Dublin on 10 August 1838, he moved to England in 1855. He was instrumental in the founding of the Masonic and Military Order of the Red Cross of Constantine in 1865 shortly followed by the Societas Rosicruciana In Anglia in 1866.

He died of tuberculosis at 7 St. Martin's Road, Stockwell on 12 April 1878 at the age of 39 and was buried on 17 April 1878 in Camberwell Old Cemetery where his memorial can be visited at any time.

Readings were delivered by the Graham Flight, Grand Sovereign of the Red Cross of Constantine and John Paternoster, Supreme Magus S.R.I.A.

The Revd Frank A Chappell, Grand High Prelate, offered the Prayers and a Blessing and provided the words for the ceremony.
